






Student body

The School has over 3,000 students: 1,900 undergraduates studying on six finance and management courses; 1,200 postgraduates studying on 18 different Specialist Masters courses in finance, insurance, actuarial science, real estate, management, energy and shipping; 270 MBA students and 100 doctoral students.



International activities

In 2007, the Executive MBA in Dubai was launched in collaboration with the Dubai International Financial Centre (DIFC). In addition to a general Executive MBA, the Cass Executive MBA in Dubai offers three specialist streams in Islamic Finance, Energy and Entrepreneurship. The Islamic Finance stream was the first of its kind in the world.

Cass boasts study abroad partnerships and collaborations with leading institutions across all five continents, giving our students valuable international exposure.

Resources for entrepreneurs

The Cass Entrepreneurship Fund was created in 2010 with the support of Peter Cullum, CBE, high-profile Cass MBA *alumnus* and founder and Non-Executive Chairman of insurance group Towergate Partnership. The Fund forms part of the Peter Cullum Centre for Entrepreneurship which provides a focal point for entrepreneurs at Cass, offering access to entrepreneurship courses and venture capital expertise, as well as the opportunity to apply for investment.

Cass milestones

- 2002: The School changes its name from City University
 Business School to Sir John
 Cass Business School, usually abbreviated to Cass Business
 School.
- **2003:** The Queen officially opens the Bunhill Row site.
- **2004:** The 22nd Mais Lecture is delivered, the City of London's foremost event for practitioners.
- **2005:** Cass launches its annual China Symposium as part of the Cass MBA.
- **2006:** The School celebrates its 40th anniversary, four decades of successful growth.
- **2007:** Cass launches an Executive MBA in Dubai in collaboration with the DIFC.
- **2008:** Cass announces plans for the Peter Cullum Centre for Entrepreneurship to offer expert advice, funding and support for businesses.
- 2009: The first Onassis Prize is presented by the School's Centre for Shipping, Trade and Finance. It was the first award made outside of Greece to bear the Onassis name.
- **2010:** Cass gains the triple crown, the gold standard in business education.
- **2011:** Cass Consulting is launched to offer research and consultancy services to businesses.
- **2012:** Cass announces its strategic plan, which includes the considerable expansion of its Executive Education programmes.
- 2013: Cass opened a new site for its Executive Education and Executive MBA programmes in London's financial heartland at 200 Aldersgate Street.
